As I reflect over the years that we've known each other, here are some of the fond memories and events which occurred that stand out in my mind:

- The Summer the Price's invited me to stay in their home so that I could work to earn money for my Fall tuition.

- Baby securing white uniforms for me and Lynn to wear when we worked as counter girls at the lunch counter in the neighborhood drug store.

- One adventure, of many, when Janice, Lynn, and I (chaperoned by Baby, of course) hitch-hiked to D.C. to see a live concert of the Staple Singers at the Howard Theatre...that was a treat!

- Pops seeing to it that Sunday morning found us at Ebenezer Baptist Church in worship services, no matter how late we stayed up on a Saturday night.

- The surprise birthday party that the family gave me for my 19th birthday...I was really touched by their kindness.

- Baby's never scolding me. She was like a second mother; she never ceased giving motherly advice to me as a young girl growing up in an adult world. Pops was like a father. I cherished his words of

counseling, wisdom and encouragement.

- Baby visiting us at school. She brought enough goodies for us to share with our friends.

I shall never forget when Baby had an occasion to visit me in my home state of Texas and spend time in my home and my mother's home. She was so amazed at the amount of open land around homes, businesses, churches and all of the undeveloped land that she saw. She also saw an oil well and derricks that really impressed her. During her visit, she continued her practice of writing down mottoes which she saw on church marquees. We had a marvelous time!

Baby will always have a special place in my heart. She was a real trooper to the end. I will always love and cherish her and the many fond memories with which she impacted my life.
