On March 9, 1950 in Alexandria, Virginia, Gerald and Elsie Thomas were blessed with a special bundle of joy they named Geoffrey Carleton. This blessing transitioned from this life to life everlasting on Thursday, December 8, 2016 at the INOVA Fairfax Hospital in Fairfax, Virginia surrounded by his loving wife and family.

Geoffrey, aka “Bosco”, “Spook”, and finally “Spider” was educated in the Alexandria Public School System having attended Charles-Houston Elementary, Parker-Gray and George Washington High Schools. He was a typical mischievous student whose personality got him in and out of a lot of trouble. He went on to enlist in the U.S. Marine Corps and was medically discharged after serving in Viet Nam.

In 1982, he married the former Lorraine Farrow. From this union was born two children. Even though the marriage ended in divorce, they successfully co-parented their children into adulthood.

Jeff’s life was an adventure — of course that’s putting it mildly. His adventures caused him to visit and be boarded at an array of different “schools”. Upon relocating to his hometown, Alexandria, Virginia, he and his loving wife joined the historic Ebenezer Baptist Church under the pastorate of Rev. Albert P. Jackson. At Ebenezer, Geoffrey was not a pew sitter. He was an active participant in all facets of the church. He was the Chairman of the men's ministry (The Brotherhood), Sunday School teacher and leader of the Small Group Initiative. From the Small Group Initiative, God laid it on Jeff's heart to start a Bible Study based out of Booker T's Barber Shop on Queen Street. What started as a Small Group ministry grew into a weekly Bible Study Ministry with 30+ men at the barber shop. It recently celebrated its two-year anniversary.

He was most recently employed by the Alexandria Pest Control Company as a Licensed Technician. He thoroughly enjoyed his work. In his spare time, he loved to showcase his culinary skills. He was an excellent cook!!!

Geoffrey loved and adored his wife, his children, grandchildren, his “Rock Star” sisters (as he called them), all of his nieces and nephews to include greats and great-greats, and his entire family. He has been referred to as the “Gentle Giant”, but he became the “Man Among Men” that God promised his mother, the one and only “Ms. Elsie” the day he was born. We will miss his physical presence, but we are comforted in knowing that he is resting with God having completed his assignment and hearing God say — “Well done,

thy good and faithful servant”.
