Joanne Hogan was born on July 16, 1944, in Washington, DC, at Columbia Hospital for Women.

She was the eldest of eight children born to her mother, Alice Payne, and the third eldest to her father,

Tatten Washington Payne. Affectionately known as “Sister,” Joanne spent her early years in Washington,

DC, where she was part of a singing group called the Montgomery Singers, alongside her Aunt Annette and Cousin Jeanette.

As a teenager, Joanne moved to Fairfax, VA, where she attended Luther Jackson High School. During this

time, she met and married her late husband, Thomas Hogan, on October 30, 1959. Sister had an

adventurous spirit, and the couple soon traveled to London. They later welcomed two sons, Thomas

Hogan Jr., and Bryant Hogan. Known for her kindness, Sister had a generous heart—if someone

complimented her on her jewelry or belongings, she would offer them with a smile, saying, “You take it.”

She had a love for old movies and "Doo-Wop" music and enjoyed seeing artists like Ike & Tina Turner

perform at venues like the Shamrock.

In 1966, Joanne began her career at Sleepy Hollow Nursing Home. Starting as an assistant, she worked her way up to Head Certified Nursing Assistant, dedicating over 40 years to her profession. Her compassion extended to every patient, and she would never tolerate mistreatment of them or her loved ones. Her career was a reflection of her caring nature—always offering a helping hand and kind words to those in need.

Sister also loved spending time with her family, especially during long drives along Skyline Drive, accompanied by music. She cherished the moments spent with her family, particularly the younger children, and often reminisced about the good old days. Her devotion to her sons, extended family, and friends was unwavering. She shared a special bond with her late brother, Nathaniel (Buck) Payne.

Joanne was preceded in death by her parents, Tatten Washington Payne, and Alice Payne; her husband, Thomas Hogan; her brother, Nathaniel Payne; and her sisters, Roberta (Birdie) Redmon and Minnie Viola Jackson.
