Johnny (John) Lee Bonds, 70, passed away on March 24, 2017 at his home in Accokeek, Maryland. He was born on June 19, 1946 in Chauncey, Georgia to Joe and Rollena (Burch) Bonds.

Johnny grew up in Umatilla, Florida. He attended high school at Eustis Vocational High School in Eustis, Florida and graduated in 1964. After high school, he joined the Army in 1966 and served in the Vietnam War. He was the recipient of medals for Good Conduct, Vietnam Service, Armed Force Expeditionary, Vietnam Campaign, Sharpshooter M-14, National Defense Service and two overseas service bars. He was honorably discharged in 1975, achieving the rank of Sergeant. He attended college at American University in Washington, DC where he received a Bachelors of Science in Administration of Justice in 1976. In 1977, Johnny married Carol in Eastman, Georgia,. They were happily married for 39 years.

Johnny was a dedicated civil servant for over 40 years. He worked for the U.S. Secret Service as an Uniformed Division Officer for ten years. He also worked for U.S. Customs Service as a Senior Special Agent and retired after 23 years. Most recently, he worked as an armed guard for the U.S. Marshals Service for 14 years. Throughout his career, he received numerous awards and citations for excellent performance including the Commissioner's Unit Citation in recognition of his outstanding efforts and dedication in support of

the U.S. Customs mission. For relaxation, Johnny enjoyed watching football, basketball, western movies and exercising..

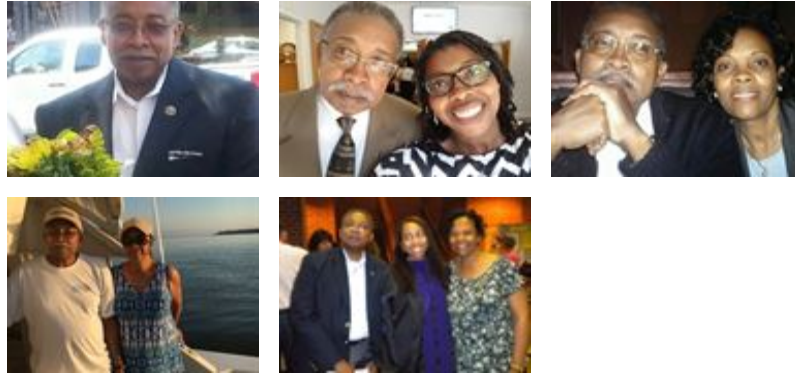
