Tracy will be remembered for his feisty, passionate personality, strong determination, will-power, always striving to accomplish his goals, and taking advantage of adventures that came his way. He enjoyed spending time with family and friends where he was known for brightening up the room with his contagious laughter, infamous dance moves and broad smile. He enjoyed listening to reggae music, grilling, playing cards and traveling. Tracy possessed an abundance of energy, which he showered unselfishly to close family and friends. 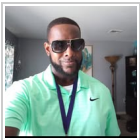
